Storm Issues from January 9-10th – we lost a breaker in the 3rd St. substation. It's basically unplugged and will need to have the system shutdown to repair it. The shutoff could last roughly an 1-1/2 hour. We also had another issue with the breaker at the 4th Street substation. It might still be under warranty; will need to have Meyers (the manufacturer) come in and look it over.

We need to order transformers for the 2400/4160s system. These were the ones that were stolen and need to be replaced. We know of at least 2 customers who would need them since they are planning to build soon. Will work on getting quotes for some transformers for this system.

Would like to get quotes for tree cutting services to clear lines for areas like Miller Hill and Dutch Hill.

STREETS/WATER SUPERINTENDENT:

Would like to sell the John Deere and the Mahindra tractors and replace them with a new tractor. The 2003 John Deere tractor has been in bad shape for quite some time; now the 4WD doesn't work. This tractor is used at the ice rink to clear the snow off. There are broom and blower attachments as well. Also, the 2018 Mahindra tractor has issues with it and trying to find parts is getting more difficult. Streets/Water Supt. is asking to obtain quotes to purchase a new tractor that will be utilized by the sewer department for mowing in the summer months and the ice rink during the winter months for clearing snow.

Wanted to inform the board that Street/Water worker D. Gassman has intentions to resign from his position effective February 7th.

An update was given on the Water Project. Northrups has installed as much water main as they are going to install and are going to wait until the weather clears up to continue. They are hoping by mid-March to have more water mains in place. They are currently working on doing service transfers now. They are averaging 7

services transfers per day. We are waiting for Crosby's Easement to be finalized to continue drilling from the park to the other side of Fourth Street.

 Clean up the drains so the water can flow through, sidewalks should be cleaned out at area business's entry ways. Streets/Water Supt. stated they switched to 30% salt/sand mixture.
- 2. Winter Projects Streets/Water Supt. stated they have been working on the skating rink to get that up and running. Also plan to weld up a different "V" plow for the skid steer. Have we looked into getting a brush for it to sweep the sidewalks? Streets/Water Supt. stated they can cost anywhere from \$7800-8000 for the attachment.
