Built to Plan Skate Park EIA Grant \$50,000.00

Local Law #7 of 2023 Proposed Zoning Code Amendments to 2012 Zoning Local Law adopted March 12, 2012 still on pause.

Stewart Ritchie of Native Farm Offerings is looking at 11 Martha for a cannabis dispensary. Richie was told to start with a zoning permit to get a copy of the application and will be submitted to the planning board. The products sold at his store will be regulated. Inspected by the state, each product will come with a QR code that, when scanned, will tell the consumer the history of the product, its exact ingredients, and it's exact levels of potency. A percentage of the product will also be home grown on this farm, he said, with supplemental products being used from other regulated growers.

Shannon Carscallen – owns E'ville spirits spoke about wanting a solution for Monroe Street closings during events. She has talked to the chamber and they have done nothing about it. Mayor Burrell stated that it deserves discussion.

Ellicottville Medical Equipment Loan Center – Kathleen Moriarty spoke on behalf of the Bob McCarthy Foundation. The Interfaith Caregivers of Olean informed the board of their wish to bring and existing medical equipment loan center closer to Village seniors. This program will be fully funded and operated by volunteers and caregivers. Medical durables and senior transportation will hopefully come in the future. The request is to use the space that was formerly Kelly and Harry's office located at the DPW building on Mill

Street. The plans have been in discussion for some time, she said. The interfaith board is hoping for a first quarter opening in 2024, provided all goes well.

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF ELLICOTTVILLE, IN
THE COUNTY OF CATTARAUGUS, NEW YORK, HEREBY RESOLVES (by the favorable
vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of said Board of Trustees) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Village of Ellicottville, in the County of Cattaraugus, New York (herein called the "Village"), is hereby authorized to issue bonds in a principal amount not to exceed \$230,000 pursuant to the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called the "Law"), to finance the acquisition and installation of replacement downtown streetlights.

Section 2. The estimated maximum cost of the project described herein, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof, is \$230,000 and said amount is hereby appropriated for such purpose. The plan of financing includes the issuance of bonds in a principal amount not to exceed \$230,000 to finance said appropriation, and the levy

and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the Village to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 3. The following additional matters are hereby determined and declared:

- (a) The period of probable usefulness of the object or purpose for which said bonds are authorized to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 35 of the Law, is five (5) years.
- (b)The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, may be applied to reimburse the Village for expenditures made after the effective date of this resolution for the purpose for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.
- (c) The proposed maturity of the bonds authorized by this resolution will not exceed five (5) years.

Section 4. Each of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity as prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said bonds, and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, shall be general obligations of the Village, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the Village. Any CHIPS funds received, or any funds from other sources, are authorized to be used to pay all or part of the cost

of the project described herein or to pay debt service on any bonds or notes issued pursuant to this resolution.

- (a) The period of probable usefulness applicable to the object or purpose for which said bonds are authorized to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 20 (c) of the Law, is fifteen (15) years.
- (b) The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, may be applied to reimburse the Village for expenditures made after the effective date of this resolution for the purpose for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.
- (c) The proposed maturity of the bonds authorized by this resolution will exceed five (5) years.

- (a) The period of probable usefulness applicable to the object or purpose for which said bonds are authorized to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 20 (f) of the Law, is ten (10) years.
- (b) The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, may be applied to reimburse the Village for expenditures made after the effective date of this resolution for the purpose for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.
