WIND TURBINE RESOLUTION

Resolution Town Board, Town of Dunkirk In Opposition to the Lake Erie Wind Turbines

WHEREAS, the Town is aware of efforts to place wind energy turbines in Lake Erie in the vicinity of the Town of Dunkirk, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Dunkirk, in Chautauqua County, shares the Lake Erie coast line with other towns and cities in Western New York, and

WHEREAS, the push for such wind turbines is originating down state, and not from the local communities; this despite two New York State studies that did not recommend wind turbines in Lake Erie, and

WHEREAS, Lake Erie is a vital part of the way of life for the shoreline communities; Lake Erie contributes to the economy of the area through tourism; residents and visitors enjoy fishing, boating, wind surfing, and jet skiing in Lake Erie, and

WHEREAS, Lake Erie is the source of drinking water for many communities along the Lake Shore, and

EASEMENTS SHOREWOOD

Supervisor Penfold had informed the board that the easement request letters are ready to go out with a copy of the easements to those residence that we are requiring one from. Supervisor Penfold had also stated that we will conduct two public meetings to discuss the project and the need for easements. The first meeting will be held on Wednesday, May 8 from 5:00 P.M - 8:00

Councilmember Miller made a motion to mail out all easements along with a copy of the letter with dates for the public meetings to possibly change to the residents at a postage rate not to exceed \$60.00. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Leone and carried.

LEAD PIPE – LETTER TO RESIDENTS

Supervisor Penfold presented each board member with a copy of the Lead & Copper Water Service Line letter for their review that will be going out to all residents and businesses in the Town of Dunkirk.

She informed board members that she received the quote back from Copy Boy and would like them to decide what option we should go with.

Option #1

Black & White double-sided letter with designing and printing #10 envelopes, mail merging, folding, stuffing envelopes, sealing, and using our bulk rate permit will be a cost of \$749.03. Option #2

Double sided letter being printed in black & white, and the instructions (pictures) being printed in color, designing and printing #10 envelopes, mail merging, folding, stuffing envelopes, sealing, and using bulk rate permit will be \$893.11.

Councilman Leone made a motion to accept option #2 from Copy Boy as presented at a rate not to exceed \$925.00 for the purpose of printing letters, and all the mailings for the Lead & Copper Rule inventory letters. The motion was seconded by Councilwoman Crane and carried.

ADJOURNMENT

With no further business, a motion was made by Councilwoman Crane and seconded by Councilman Price. The motion was carried unanimously, and the meeting was adjourned at 5:40 p.m.
