Departmental Reports:

Town Clerk report for December submitted and on file. Monthly fees remitted totaled \$3,225.96; Dog License sales of \$243.00; Conservation sales of \$125.00, Building/Zoning fees of \$1,881.05, 2 Record Requests completed and 2 Marriage licenses were issued.

Quarterly billing for Water District 3 and Sewer District 1 was processed and mailed 12/28/23. January dog license renewals mailed along with 2nd reminders for all expired licenses. Collection for the 2024 Property Tax began January 8th and will be collected through February 6th penalty free. The office is continuing work with Chalifoux law on obtaining easements for the North Extension of Sewer District 1. End of year reports were completed and records have been filed in accord with the LGS-1 and transitioned to the new year. The Annual Clerk's report was copied to the Board. Town Clerk and Tax Collector records are ready for the annual committee audit.

Historian's Annual Report was submitted, filed with the Clerk's office and copied to the Board.

Assessor's report submitted and on file. The office is continuing fieldwork and receiving exemption renewals. With taxes bills being mailed, the office has been fielding phone calls and providing apportionments when needed.

Code Officer, Ken Shearer reported that the Code/Zoning Office issued 13 building permits for the Town with project values of \$388,500.00 and 6 permits for the Village with project values totaling \$27,900.00. A total of 44 permits were closed with project values of \$6,007,159.67.

The Zoning Board of Appeals had 1 hearing in December granting an area variance for a new single-family home. There are no scheduled cases for January.

Highway report was submitted and filed. Highway Superintendent reported installing new air compressor, cutting brush along the roads and ditches and plowing 8 times in December. The department read meters for the Chautauqua Shores Water District and located a water valve for a residence reported to have leaky service.

Committee Reports:

Councilman Carlson updated the Board on the status of the Comprehensive plan. The committee selected 4 out of 9 proposals that were submitted for consulting services to be interviewed on January 23, 2024

Public Comment (Non-Agenda Items):

Rebecca Magnuson, owner of She Sings Café, and contractor, Toby Hammond, addressed the Board with their complaint on the issuance of the building permit and handling of inspections during recent renovations to the café. A copy of the complaint was submitted to the Town Clerk for file.

John Neal, project manager for Empire Development, addressed the Board with complaints regarding the handling of their permit applications submitted to construct a new house and renovate existing structures on a property located in Dewittville. Letters were read from the architect working on the project as well as one from the homeowners, Mr. and Mrs. Dubois. Copies were submitted to the Town Clerk for file.
