## Pledge to the Flag

**Presentation by Norbut Solar:** The representatives introduced themselves. Connectivity for the project would be to the local substation, which would stay in the community, and under the 25 Watt maximum as set by the Public Service Commission. It would be 130 Acres over 5 sites, and they have been accepted into NYSEG's Fix Program. They do not fall under 94c, so the Town would have more control and involvement. They are not tax exempt, they would pay between \$25,000-\$30,000 in taxes to the town. A DCF program is possible but unpredictable.

Fran Hoffman: What happens when the sun comes out on a cloudy day and causes a power surge? Norbut: The line cannot exceed 80% capacity, it would not cause a surge.

Supervisor Freiner: Can individuals buy power?

Norbut: Yes, there is no contract, anyone can sign up, typically 10% annual savings.

Leath DeRitter: Are the parts made in America?

Norbut: They are not.

Terry Gordon: Why are solar companies attracted to this area? Norbut: This is where the distribution capacity is in the lines.

Fran Hoffman: How does the land get cleaned up when solar goes away.

Norbut: Solar will not be going away, it is staying as an energy source. If it were to happen, there is a

decommission plan in place.

Robert McEvoy is interested in contract work for Norbut

Councilman Butler: The Town's people are concerned about these panels surrounding the town making it ugly.

Norbut: They place panels far back from the road to help with visibility. It is not possible for every property to have panels for distribution.

Joe Miller: Who negotiates the "discount" Norbut: NYSEG does, they do not go over 10%

James Neary: Will they pay nearby property owners to put up with an eyesore?

Norbut: No they will not.

Leath DeRitter: Who is allowed to hunt on the land?

Norbut: They have licensing agreements with locals so the land can be hunted on.

Councilman Duthoy: What is an approximate start date?

Norbut: 2023-2024 depending on the application, they have not started it yet.
