RESOLUTION REGARDING THE STATE ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY REVIEW ACT PROCESS AMENDMENT FOR THE VILLAGE OF LITTLE VALLEY WATER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Village of Little Valley (Village) is proposing the Village of Little Valley Water System Improvements Project (Project); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law, as amended, the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA") and the implementing regulations at 6NYCRR Part 617 (the "Regulations"), the Village desires to comply with SEQRA and the Regulations with respect to the Project; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA") and the implementing regulations at 6 NYCRR Part 617, the Village of Little Valley previously completed the SEQRA process and passed a Negative Declaration for the proposed Project on October 12, 2021;

WHEREAS, the previously reviewed project scope included improvements to the Village's well site and water main replacement in selected locations, and replacement of water meters and services throughout the Village's existing distribution system;

WHEREAS, the Project now involves additional segments of water main replacement along State Route 242, Virginia Ave, and Rock City Street;

WHEREAS, the Village of Little Valley Village Board, as Lead Agency, has updated the Parts 1, 2, and 3 of the Full Environmental Assessment Form (FEAF) to reflect the change in project scope, and subsequently notified all Interested and Involved agencies of the amendments made to the project, in support of re-issuing a Determination of Significance;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the SEQRA Regulations, the Village of Little Valley Village Board, as Lead Agency, considered the significance of the potential environmental impacts of the amended Project by (a) using the criteria specified in Section 617.7 of the SEQRA Regulations, (b) examining the amended FEAF for the Project, including the facts and conclusions in Parts 1, 2 and 3 of the FEAF and Part 3 Evaluation Document, together with other available supporting information, to identify the relevant areas of environmental concern, and (c) thoroughly analyzing the identified areas of environmental concern:

RESOLVED, that the Village of Little Valley Village Board has completed a review of the amended SEQRA FEAF documents and confirms that the project is a Type I Action which has been determined will not have any significant adverse impact on the environment as provided in the amended FEAF documents attached hereto and hereby made a part thereof; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Mayor of the Village of Little Valley is hereby authorized to take all actions, serve all notices, and complete all documents in order to give full force and effect to this amended SEQRA process; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect immediately.
