Scott Winner inquired if the Town had hard copies of the project, CEO Samantha Testani stated she needed 2 copies and Dianne can post one in the Town Hall. He reminded everyone these are all preliminary, nothing is finalized yet.

Jim Neary: The solar panels move with the sun, will they always be tipped to the south? Scott Winner: Yes.
