# **Departmental Reports:**

Town Clerk report for December submitted and on file. Monthly fees remitted totaled \$6,405.78; Dog License sales of \$434.00; Conservation sales of \$572.00, Building/Zoning fees of \$3,259.40, 22 Record Requests completed and 1 Marriage license issued.

Quarterly billing for Water District 3 and Sewer District 1 was processed and mailed. January dog license renewals have been mailed along with 2<sup>nd</sup> reminders for November and December licenses still due. 2022 Tax Collection began January 6<sup>th</sup> and will continue through February 4<sup>th</sup> penalty free. End of year reports for Town Clerk and Tax Collector are ready for the committee to audit.

The County Executive issued a request to the Supervisors and Mayors to hand out home Covid testing kits. The Clerk's office will not be handing these kits out. Due to increased traffic in the office for tax collection, this could unnecessarily expose the community and staff in the event someone experiencing symptoms of the virus was to come in requesting a kit. The Chautauqua County Municipal Clerk's Association has sent a letter to the County Executive in opposition of this request and stated that the distribution of "at home COVID tests" should be kept to the County Health Department and/or doctor's offices.

Historian's Annual Report was submitted, filed with the Clerk's office and copied to the Board.

Assessor's report submitted and on file. The office is continuing fieldwork and receiving exemption renewals. With taxes bills being mailed, the office has been fielding phone calls and providing apportionments when needed. Reassessment Aide Funding totaling \$17,964.00 has been received and forwarded to the bookkeeper.

Deputy Clerk, Elizabeth Steinbach reported that the Code/Zoning Office issued 12 building permits with project values of \$633,250.00 and 24 permits were closed with project values of \$692,337.00. Zoning Board of Appeals have 2 variance hearings scheduled for 1/18/2022.

Highway reported on plowing. Brush cutting for Village along the walking path. Installed driveway pipe on Elm Flat Rd. Replaced ceiling tiles in office, lunchroom and bathrooms of the Highway building and painted breakroom and bathrooms.

## Local Law 1 of 2022- Recodification of Local Laws and Ordinances

#### RESOLUTION TO HOLD PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED LOCAL LAW

**WHEREAS** the Town Board of the Town of Chautauqua has entered into a project for the codification of local laws, ordinances and certain resolutions of the Town of Chautauqua for the purposes of increasing the effectiveness of town governmental administration, providing for greater public awareness of and access to town legislation and protecting the health, safety and welfare of town inhabitants; and **WHEREAS** the proposed codification has been published in loose-leaf form and the Town Board now desires to formally effect the adoption of said codification by enactment of a local law; **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that a public hearing be held by the Town Board with respect to enactment of the following local law, such public hearing to be held on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of February 2022, at 7:10p.m., in the Town Hall, Town of Chautauqua, New York. The proposed local law to be considered is as follows:

#### LOCAL LAW NO. 1 -2022

A LOCAL LAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE CODIFICATION OF THE LOCAL LAWS, ORDINANCES AND CERTAIN RESOLUTIONS OF THE TOWN OF CHAUTAUQUA INTO A MUNICIPAL CODE TO BE DESIGNATED THE "CODE OF THE TOWN OF CHAUTAUQUA"

Copies of the text of the above-named local law shall be filed in the office of the Town Clerk.

**AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Town Clerk is hereby directed and authorized to cause public notice of said hearing to be given in accordance with the Municipal Home Rule Law, the Open Meetings Law and §§ 264 and 265 of the Town Law of the State of New York.

## Assessment – Reassessment Aide

The Town's Assessor, Anne Golley, addressed the Board regarding the financial aid their office requested from the NYS Comptroller's office to assist in covering the costs of a town-wide reassessment. This aid can range between \$1 -\$5 per parcel but must be applied for upon the completion of a successful reassessment project that brings the equalization to rate to 100. This aide is offered to assist municipalities in the extra staffing and time involved in these types of projects since a 3<sup>rd</sup> party appraisal firm could costs in excess of \$300,000.00. The Comptroller's office has since approved their request and payment was received by the Town. The office is requesting the Board's consideration of reimbursing the Assessment Staff with a portion of these funds to compensate the extra time spent on this process including nights and weekends. The Supervisor asked the Town Attorney if this could be done. Mr. Seachrist stated it could but was unsure on the legal aspect since it was not agreed upon prior to the service being conducted. Mrs. Golley stated that they since they can only apply for the aid after the reassessment is completed, there is no way to determine how much will be awarded, if any.

# Town Police Department- Chautauqua Institution Security

Expenses would be compensated by the Institution through an agreement. ## Mandolin Ridge- Resolution Accepting Road Dedication

### RESOLUTION ACCEPTING ROAD DEDICATION FOR THE MANDOLIN RIDGE SUBDIVISION

WHEREAS, certain roads in the Mandolin Ridge Subdivision, located adjacent to the Chautauqua-Stedman Road, have been offered for dedication to the Town of Chautauqua (the "Town") for highway purposes by H&H Chautauqua Development, LLC, the owner of said land as shown on a subdivision survey map by EcoStrategies Engineering & Surveying, dated April 16, 2021 and recorded in the Chautauqua County Clerk's Office on May 12, 2021 as Instrument Number SD2021000005, and

WHEREAS, the Highway Superintendent of the Town of Chautauqua has recommended acceptance of said roads for dedication for highway purposes, subject to a condition that the owner put in place a bond to ensure funds will be available to repair the roads should unforeseen issues arise during the coming winter months, and

**WHEREAS**, the owner has proposed a deed for the roads, together with a 15 feet wide right-of-way adjacent thereto, and will provide a recordable copy of same once the Town accepts the dedication,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Town Board of the Town of Chautauqua, in regular session duly convened, that the Town hereby agrees to accept a deed of dedication of the roads within the Mandolin Ridge Subdivision subject to the condition that the applicant provide a bond of no less than \$300,000 to ensure the condition of the roads until Oct. 1, 2022, and further authorizes the Town Supervisor to execute any and all documents necessary to complete the conveyance and the Town Attorney to record the same in the Chautauqua County Clerk's Office, once such deed and bond have been provided.
