### **EXHIBIT A**

### **INSURANCE COVERAGE**

- 1. <u>Requirements.</u> The Company shall maintain or cause to be maintained insurance against such risks and for such amounts as are customarily insured against by businesses of like size and type paying, as the same become due and payable, all premiums in respect thereto, including, but not necessarily limited to:
- (a) (i) Insurance against loss or damage by fire, lightning and other casualties, with a uniform standard extended coverage endorsement, such insurance to be in an amount not less than the full replacement value of the Project, exclusive of excavations and foundations, as determined by a recognized appraiser or insurer selected by the Company or (ii) as an alternative to the above requirements (including the requirement of periodic appraisal), the Company may insure the Project under a blanket insurance policy or policies covering not only the Project but other properties as well.
- (b) Workers' compensation insurance, disability benefits insurance, and each other form of insurance which the Agency or the Company is required by law to provide, covering loss resulting from injury, sickness, disability or death of employees of the Company who are located at or assigned to the Project.
- (c) Insurance against loss or losses from liabilities imposed by law or assumed in any written contract and arising from personal injury and death or damage to the property of others caused by any accident or occurrence, with limits of not less than \$1,000,000 per accident or occurrence on account of personal injury, including death resulting there from, and \$1,000,000 per accident or occurrence on account of damage to the property of others, excluding liability imposed upon the Company by any applicable workers' compensation law; and a blanket excess liability policy in the amount not less than \$3,000,000, protecting the Company against any loss or liability or damage for personal injury or property damage.
- 2. Additional Provisions Respecting Insurance. (a) All insurance required shall name the Agency as a named insured and all other insurance required by Section 4 hereof shall name the Agency as an additional insured. All insurance shall be procured and maintained in financially sound and generally recognized responsible insurance companies selected by the Company and authorized to write such insurance in the State. Such insurance may be written with deductible amounts comparable to those on similar policies carried by other companies engaged in businesses similar in size, character and other respects to those in which the Company is engaged. All policies evidencing such insurance shall provide for (i) payment of the losses of the Company and the Agency as their respective interest may appear, and (ii) at least thirty (30) days' prior written notice of the cancellation thereof to the Company and the Agency.
- (b) All such policies of insurance, or a certificate or certificates of the insurers that such insurance is in force and effect, shall be deposited with the Agency on the date hereof. Prior to expiration of any such policy, the Company shall furnish the Agency evidence that the policy has been renewed or replaced or is no longer required by this Agent Agreement.

Project applicants (the "Company"), with projected / committed capital investment for facility construction of greater than or equal to \$5,000,000, as a condition to receiving Financial Assistance (including a sales tax exemption, mortgage recording tax exemption, real property tax abatement, and/or bond proceeds) from the Allegany County Industrial Development Agency (the "Agency"), will be required to employ good faith efforts to utilize qualified Local Labor first, as defined below ("First Use Local Labor"), for all projects involving the construction, expansion, equipping, demolition and/or remediation of new, existing, expanded or renovated facilities (collectively, the "Project Site"). Local Labor is defined as individuals residing in the following Counties: Allegany, Genesee, Orleans, Monroe, Wyoming, Livingston, Wayne, Ontario, Seneca, Yates, Niagara, Erie, Chautaugua and Cattaraugus (collectively, the "Local Labor Area"). First Use Local Labor includes a good faith 90% local labor goal of the total number of Project employees, excluding construction project management and the general contractor, of subcontractors or subcontractors to a subcontractor (collectively, the "Workers") working on the Project Site residing within the Local Labor Area. Companies do not have to be local companies as defined herein, but must strive to first employ local Workers residing within the Local Labor Area. It is understood that at certain times, Workers residing within the Local Labor Area may not be qualified or available with respect to a Project. This could include the following circumstances: (i) warranty issues related to installation of specialized equipment or materials whereby the manufacturer requires installation by only approved installers; (ii) specialized construction for which qualified Local Labor Area Workers are not qualified or available; (iii) documented lack of Workers meeting the Local Labor Area requirement; or (iv) cost differentials in bids whereby use of local labor increases the construction cost of the project in the sole opinion of the Company.

### Local Labor Reporting Requirement

Companies authorized to receive Financial Assistance from the Agency will be required to file or cause to be filed a Local Labor Utilization Report (the "Report") on such form as made available by the Agency, and as directed by the Agency, which will identify, for each Worker, the city, town, or village and associated zip code that each such Worker is domiciled in. In the event a subcontractor or subcontractor to a subcontractor refuses to provide, or otherwise is unable to provide Worker data, Company will not be penalized in any way so long as Company notifies the Agency of this inability. The Report shall be submitted to the Agency or its designated agents as follows: (i) immediately prior to commencement of construction activities; and (ii) on or by the next following quarterly dates of January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1 and each quarterly date thereafter through the construction completion date. If Agency staff determines that: (i) the Local Labor goal is not being met for other than i) warranty issues related to installation of specialized equipment or materials whereby the manufacturer requires installation by only approved installers; (ii) specialized construction for which qualified Local Labor Area Workers are not available; (iii) documented lack of Workers meeting the Local Labor Area requirement; or (iv) cost differentials in bids whereby use of local labor increases the construction cost of the project; then written justification by the company must be submitted to the agency as to the reason the goal is not attainable. If there is no reason given and no good faith effort was made to meet the goal, then the Agency may commence negotiation of an amended Financial Assistance proposal commensurate with the attainable Worker metric in accordance with the terms of the underlying agreements between the Agency and the Company with respect to the Project. The foregoing terms have been read, reviewed and understood by the Company and all appropriate personnel. The undersigned agrees and understands that the information contained herein must be transmitted and conveyed in a timely fashion to all applicable subcontractors, suppliers and materialmen. Furthermore, the undersigned realized and understands that failure to abide by the terms herein could result in the Agency revoking a portion of Financial Assistance, whether already received or to be received by the Company, as it deems reasonable in its sole discretion for violation hereof.

### Factory Repurpose to Green Energy

As an existing manufacturer for over the last 90 years in the Wellsville NY area, we have a long-established history as a local employer, with the average seniority of close to 20 years and several multigenerational employees. Over the decades Ljungstrom has employed as many as 815 people at its peak and over the last decade has averaged around 530 employees. As the global headquarters for Ljungstrom our U.S.A. employee mix of salary vs hourly is approximately 50/50 with the majority of the salary holding an associate degree or higher. However, as the coal power industry declines, our New York State workforce has been reduced to its current levels of 196 and without a change in direction will continue to reduce with the coal industry. With our existing capacity, workforce knowledge, and an established reputation in the power industry, we are uniquely positioned for a transition into the carbon capture and green power industry.

NYS green power initiative includes offshore wind turbines which is creating a market for secondary steel structures that we are ideally suited to support. The additional capabilities required to transition our factory include a painting/coating process and structural steel prefabrication. Over the past eighteen months, Ljungstrom has developed the necessary certifications and approvals, by the end customer, regarding the quality control, environmental, safety, manufacturing processes, and are approved as a supplier with the exception of the coating process. Currently, we are pursuing five of the sixteen active offshore wind projects awarded to date and when the remaining projects enter the construction phase, we will be an equipped and approved supplier for this market. At this time approximately 8.5 gigawatts of electrical power have been awarded from the 30 gigawatts of identified projects along the east coast.

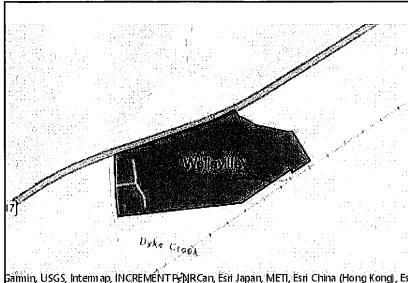
Environmental drive for carbon neutral society has created a new carbon capture industry. In partnership with Svante, a leading carbon adsorption media developer, we have incorporated their media into a structure similar to our Ljungstrom Air Preheater equipment to create a regenerative carbon capture system for the cement, oil & gas and industrial markets. Currently our first prototype carbon capture system is in qualification testing at Husky oil in Saskatchewan Canada. Larger units for the cement industry are in development with an anticipated project for Lafarge Holcim in 2022. Since carbon capture system utilizes our existing Air Preheater, we have the equipment required for manufacturing however, our machining equipment is outdated and need to be standardized to current technology.

Both the offshore wind and carbon capture markets require a high-level preparation and protective coating process. This coating will be completed to a stringent quality control process, which requires additional certified inspectors and technicians working under a quality process developed by this project. Building alterations will involve modifying a 20,000 sq ft area of the Wellsville factory to temperature and humidity-controlled environment and incorporates a shed extension of the building to protect the various booths and auxiliary equipment from the elements.
